## **Seven Strategies to Teach Students Text Comprehension ...**

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Directly teach comprehension skills: Students should be directly taught comprehension skills such as sequencing, story structure using the plot mountain, how to make an inference and draw a conclusion, and the different types of figurative language. Students should have the opportunity to first use the skills with

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text that they hear the teacher read aloud, and then later with text that they read independently at their own level.

17. Personalize learning objectives or approaches. Personalized learning is always a good idea, but in remote teaching, it may be even more critical than a standard classroom (if for no other reason than it's easier to 'lose' students or for students to 'hide' during synchronous distance learning).

Teach word-study skills. For example, classifying and sorting words by spelling patterns helps students develop vocabulary and provides opportunities to transfer spelling concepts from reading to writing. Integrate reading with writing

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and use a variety of genres and formats as a springboard for writing activities.
